### Checklists for shaping awareness work at FAU

# **Checklist B** Raising awareness among target groups (e.g. students, participants)

# In order to raise sensitivity and awareness for a respectful and safe event free from harassment and discrimination among all participants, it is necessary that you know your target group and inform or train them in a way suited to their needs.

#### 1. Who is your target group?

- Who are the visitors, participants or users in your setting?
- How similar or different are the various members in this group?
- How would you assess the participants' awareness level?
- Are there any aspects concerning participants' previous experiences or needs that may require certain skills or prevention measures to be taken into account (e.g. particularly vulnerable participants/multiple discrimination/accessibility)?
- How can the target group's expertise be used to increase inclusion and freedom from discrimination for all?

#### 2. What would you like to share with your participants?

- What should everyone attending the event be aware of? What breadth and depth of coverage is appropriate or necessary?
- What depth of information or training would you like to offer to participants?
- Would you predominantly like to pass on information about inappropriate and unacceptable behavior, or would you prefer to give specific positive impulses on how to act and/or state possible consequences or sanctions?

#### 3. How would you like to inform, educate and raise the awareness of participants?

- Which methods or channels would you like to use to reach participants?
- How can you ensure that all those present have received and understood the information?

#### 4. Next steps

Based on these considerations, you can now start to raise the awareness of your participants. Feel free to use ideas and best practice examples from the toolkit.
